Trocaire Corner—Mahlet

Mahlet (pictured on Trócaire Box) is thirteen years old and comes from Sebeya in northern Ethiopia. Last year, it only rained three times in this area. As a result, crops failed, people became hungry and animals were forced to eat dried twigs and cactus plants. This happened because of climate change. Each year in Mahlet's village becomes more difficult than the last because it is difficult to predict what the weather will be like. This area used to be green and swampy but now is a barren dessert, a wasteland where nothing grows. As we follow Christ into the wilderness for the forty days of Lent, let us also remember young Mahlet and her family who remain in the barren desert throughout the year. Trócaire will be working with a local partner there towards installing a water irrigation project whereby farmers will have water for their crops and food for their families and animals. What's in a Word? Transfiguration

According to Tradition, the Transfiguration occurred on Mt. Tabor, but some believe it may have taken place on Mt. Hermon or even the Mount of Olives. Various reasons for the Transfiguration have been offered. (1) that Christ wanted to bolster the faith of the Apostles prior to His crucifixion and death, so they would recognize that, just as His divine glory is hidden beneath His human appearance, so too a real victory would be concealed in the apparent defeat of the cross; (2) that the disciples would know that Christ is truly divine, with Moses and Elijah bearing witness to Him, and the voice of God speaking from the cloud; (3) that all Christians would learn to hope for their own glory, as they are being transformed by Christ's grace.
