

Palm Sunday



Next Sunday is Palm (Passion) Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. It is our 'passion' time now and, as followers of Jesus Christ, we are invited to unite this passion or time of suffering with that of Christ.

This time calls for a deep faith or a rekindling of faith where it has waned. As there will be no Mass, I ask you to cut a piece of palm, place it in a vase, place that in a prominent place in your house and bless (sprinkle) it with Holy Water at lunch time. With your family, pause and reflect for a quiet moment.
